13, 14, 15, & 21 Floral Art classes are floral foam (oasis) free however eco-friendly and biodegradable alternatives can be used.

16 Please note the new rule for Team Cookery – that all teams must have at least one competitor who is 18 years old on the day of the County final (23rd May 2026). There is no mystery ingredient element in this year's competition.

22, 23, 24, 25, & 45 Members with food allergies are advised NOT to enter any eating or drinking competitions. Should they enter, they must inform YFYFC of their allergy on the entry form.

27, 28, & 29 Please note only 1 entry per club in each of the Tug-of-War classes.

69, 70, & 71 Exhibits will become the artistic property of YFYFC and will be used for YFC marketing and development purposes.

72, 73, 74, & 75 Exhibits will be retained by YFYFC and displayed at the Great Yorkshire Show on 14th – 17th July 2026.

Any exhibit in County Rally – the President's Choice winning exhibit will be retained by YFYFC and displayed at the Great Yorkshire Show on 14th – 17th July 2026 unless it is an item of food or floral art.

There is no Fence Erecting competition or Farm Machinery Skills at County Rally 2026, as these competitions were held at the Rural Skills Day on Saturday 1st November 2025.

Under 18s will need a signed parental consent form.

18s and over will need a second form of ID.

1 AGE

Junior	Competitors to be aged 16 or under on 1 st September 2025 born on or after 1 st September 2008
Intermediate	Competitors to be aged 21 or under on 1 st September 2025 born on or after 1 st September 2003
Senior	Competitors to be aged 28 or under on 1 st September 2025 born on or after 1 st September 1997

OPEN/SENIOR COMPETITIONS

Both these competitions can be entered by anyone, unless a restriction is stated, however it is only the competitions classed as "senior" that will go towards the Senior Trophy.

2 ENTRIES

Unless otherwise stated competition entry is free. All deposits required are stated under the competition name, on certain competitions fines will be applicable if a competitor or team does not turn up. This will be stated along with the amount on the competition rules and entry form.

Members are allowed to move up age categories unless otherwise stated.

Members may enter more than one competition outside of Section 1 Stockjudging The steward in charge of the competition **MUST** be notified if a competitor is running late.

NO NEW ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON RALLY DAY.

3 SECTION ONE ENTRIES (Classes 1 to 20)

Club Secretaries to send entries direct to **DISTRICT SECRETARIES**

Representation: District entries to County

- 1-5 Competing Clubs three go forward
- 6 and over Competing Clubs four go forward (Cledales only)

STOCKJUDGING COMPETITIONS

A competitor may enter only one stock judging competition in this section. Substitution in the stock judging classes can be made by informing County Office **on the substitutions/withdrawals form** no later than **9.00am Thursday 14th May 2026.**

NFYFC COOKERY/FLORAL ART

Competitors may enter only one of these competitions as the timetable does not allow for entry in both.

4 SECTION TWO ENTRIES (Classes 21 - 48)

Club Secretaries to send entries direct to County Office. Two entries per club. All work must be done at the Rally Site unless otherwise stated. If Districts are holding Section Two at their District Rally, please make members aware that they **DO NOT QUALIFY** to County Rally from the District Rally but **NEED TO ENTER, BEFORE THE DISTRICT RALLIES, DIRECTLY TO COUNTY.**

5 SECTION THREE ENTRIES (Classes 49 - 76)

Club Secretaries to send entries direct to County Office. Each club may enter each class twice* only and each competitor may enter only once in each class. *GYS classes permit three entries per club which is the only exception to the rule. All work must be made specifically for the 2026 County Rally. **Exhibits MUST NOT be removed before 4.00pm on the day of the Rally.** If Districts are holding Section Three at their District Rally please make members aware that they **DO NOT QUALIFY** to County Rally from the District Rally but **NEED TO ENTER, BEFORE THE DISTRICT RALLIES, DIRECTLY TO COUNTY.**

CHANGES CANNOT BE MADE TO ENTRY FORMS AFTER DISTRICT RALLIES – NAMES CAN BE SUBSTITUTED ON THE SUBSTITUTIONS FORM BUT ADDITIONAL ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

6 NORTHERN AREA ELIMINATORS

The first three placed competitors in the Northern Area Eliminators will be required to go forward to represent the County at the 2026 Northern Area Field Day to be held on Saturday 13th June 2026 at Middle Ord Farm, Berwick-upon-Tweed, TD15 2XQ hosted by Northumberland Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs.

The following competitions will go through to the Field Day: Beef, Lamb, Sheep and Mystery judging, 4X4 and Trailer Handling, Open Pallet Challenge, Open Floral Art (Wild West) Boat Race 18+, Half Yard of Ale (female), Yard of Ale (male), Auctioneering, all Tug of War competitions, Machine Shearing, Line Dancing, Chairs Challenge, Make a Reel, Horse Shoe Quoits, Plaiting, Rodeo Bull, Modelling, Bush Tucker Trial, Decorated Cowboy Hat, Sheriff's Badge, Western Saddle Pad, Fashion, all baking and cookery classes, Boot Rack, Quoits Set, Hobby Horse, Saddle Rack, Photography, Wanted Poster, Liqueur, and Cube Exhibit (Our Favourite Place).

7 NFYFC COMPETITIONS WEEKEND (4th JULY & 5th JULY 2026)

NFYFC Fence Erecting and NFYFC Farm Machinery Skills, (held at Rural Skills Day 2025) and NFYFC Auctioneering.

8 MENS, LADIES & JUNIOR GENSB TUG OF WAR FINALS (1st AUGUST 2026)

Held at the Tenbury Show, Worcestershire, WR15 8AR.

9 MALVERN AUTUMN SHOW (26th & 27th SEPTEMBER 2026)

Competitors may not enter more than one competition held at the Malvern Show: Team Cookery (Festival Food theme), Junior, Intermediate and Senior Floral Arts (Electricity, Rumble in the Jungle, and Red Sky at Night).

10 PLEASE NOTE THAT THESE RULES WERE CORRECT WHEN SENT TO PRESS (December 2025) HOWEVER SHOULD RULES CHANGE PRIOR TO THE COUNTY RALLY, CLUBS WILL BE NOTIFIED VIA MEMBERS E-NEWS. UPDATED RULES WILL BE POSTED ON THE YORKSHIRE FYFC WEBSITE AND VIA FACEBOOK. PLEASE NOTE ALL NA ELIMINATORS HAVE BEEN SET BY EITHER NFYFC OR NORTHUMBERLAND FEDERATION OF YOUNG FARMERS' CLUBS IN THEIR ROLE AS NA FIELD DAY ORGANISERS 2026.

11 DIGITAL MEMBERSHIP CARDS

ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE MEMBERS OF YFYFC BEFORE 31st MARCH 2026; NO DIGITAL MEMBERSHIP CARDS WILL BE ISSUED AFTER THE 31st MARCH 2026. MEMBERS MUST BRING A VALID DIGITAL MEMBERSHIP CARD ON THEIR SMART PHONE OR A PRINTED OUT COPY OF THE DIGITAL MEMBERSHIP CARD WITH THEM TO THE COUNTY RALLY. ANYONE WHO DOES NOT SHOW THEIR DIGITAL MEMBERSHIP CARD (BUT IS CHECKED OFF AT THE CONTROL DESK AS A MEMBER) WILL BE ISSUED WITH A WRISTBAND FOR THE DAY. ALL MEMBERS AGED 18+ MUST SUPPLY A SECOND FORM OF ID (Passport, Driving Licence, Birth Certificate). ALL MEMBERS AGED UNDER 18, MUST HAVE A SIGNED PARENTAL CONSENT FORM TO BE ABLE TO COMPETE AS STATED BY NFYFC.

If a digital membership card is checked and found to be invalid, then the competitor will be **disqualified** from competing on the day.

12 JUDGING - THE JUDGES AND STEWARDS DECISION IS FINAL.

President's Choice Award Trophy & President's Choice Certificate Rules

The current County President will award their own trophy entitled "The President's Choice Award" to **any entry in Section 3** of County Rally which they believed stood out the most, displayed great workmanship and was in the spirit of Yorkshire Young Farmers. The current County President will also award the "President's Choice Certificate" to **any entry in Section 1, 2 or 3** of County Rally which they believed stood out the most, displayed great workmanship and was in the spirit of Yorkshire Young Farmers.

The awards can be presented to **any exhibits** even if they have not been placed by the competition judge who was judging that class. The County President may also award "Highly Commended" prize cards to any entry in Section, 1, 2 or 3. The County President's allocation of the winners will be final, and no arguments will be entered into. If appropriate, the exhibits will then be displayed at the Great Yorkshire Show in the Young Farmers' Pavilion.

13 VERBAL ABUSE

Aggressive behaviour in any form from a competitor or a member of the public on behalf of a competitor to the Judge or Steward will result in that competitor being disqualified. Yorkshire Federation of Young Farmer's Clubs will be following the NFYFC Winning Behaviour Policy 2022.

14 POINTS

Points will be awarded on the basis of:

1st	6 points	2nd	5 points	3rd	4 points
4th	3 points	5th	2 points	6th	1 point

In sections 2 and 3, 1 point will be given for every member who enters a competition and competes on the day or brings their exhibit – the exception to this is the Cube Exhibit. Points for Cube Exhibit are as follows: 6 marks will be awarded for the overall display and 6 marks for the best interpretation of each theme, 5 for the second etc, allowing a maximum of 36 points to be awarded.

WHERE A CLUB HAS TWO OR MORE ENTRIES IN ONE COMPETITION, ONLY THE HIGHEST SCORING ENTRY WILL COUNT TOWARDS TROPHIES/POINTS.



TIMETABLE

This timetable is subject to change at short notice/upon receipt of entries.

Competitions with specific finish times mean competitors must have competed before this time.

Where specific report times are given, all competitors/a team representative must turn up at this time. This is to allow time for a draw to be made before the competition starts and for some Section 2 events, as noted, members will be given a time slot to come back at, to compete. Please note some competitions have two windows during the day to allow for stewards' lunch breaks. However, all competitors/team rep will need to sign-in at the first report time to get their time slot to compete. Some competitions require all competitors/teams to compete/turn up at the report time together. These are noted with a *. Some venues may change depending on weather/space required upon receipt of entries, but all will be clearly signposted! Due to the number of competitions, there will not be enough time for every member to take part in every competition. Members are reminded to take responsibility for the times of their own competitions on the day and understand that they will not be able to enter events where times clash. The finish time/time you are given is as stated and stewards will not wait after that time. It is members' own responsibility to attend the competition before that time/manage their own timetable.

The timetable does not allow members to take part in both NFYFC Cookery and Floral Art competitions.

Members are only permitted to take part in one Stock Judging in Section 1.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** complement the theme and be neat and tidy. Competitors may use floral foam; this will not affect the marking. Alternative mechanics may also be used.

At County Rally, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

14 INTERMEDIATE FLORAL ART (21 and Under) (NFYFC)

The competitor must be 21 years of age or under on 1st September 2025.

Exhibit Title: "Rumble in the Jungle" – A front facing exhibit to the theme **"Rumble in the Jungle."**

The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide X 60cm deep X optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** complement the theme and be neat and tidy. Competitors may use floral foam; this will not affect the marking. Alternative mechanics may also be used.

At County Rally, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

15 SENIOR FLORAL ART (28 and Under) (NFYFC)

The competitor must be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2025.

Exhibit Title: "Red Sky at Night" – A front facing exhibit to the theme **"Red Sky at Night."**

The maximum display area for each competitor **MUST NOT exceed 76cm wide X 60cm deep X optional height** (i.e. no limitations to height). Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories.

Exhibit is to be viewed from the front. Competitors own backboard and base boards are allowed and must be provided by the competitor if required and must adhere to the size limitations. The reverse of these backboards **MUST** complement the theme and be neat and tidy. Competitors may use floral foam; this will not affect the marking. Alternative mechanics may also be used.

At County Rally, the exhibit will be displayed on a table with a white table covering.

PROCEDURES FOR ALL FLORAL ART CLASSES

DISPLAY

A worktable will be provided close to the display area – approx. half a trestle table to be allocated per competitor. Each exhibit will be displayed to their best advantage with the space allocation. All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitors and must be assembled in the hall. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards, under penalty of instant disqualification. No other person, other than the competitors, will be allowed in the competing area. At the YFYFC final, YFYFC will provide an exhibition card for each display and workspace. Competitors may use a battery-operated glue gun or any other form of adhesive. There will no mains power supply available.

Any exhibit exceeding the maximum measurements will be disqualified. The measurement will be from the outside edges of the back board or base board (i.e. the thickness of the backboard will be included in the size restrictions). Any accessories or drapes used on the outside of the back board or base board will be included in the overall measurement of the exhibit and should be within the size restrictions. The external side of the back board will be taken into account for the attractiveness of the exhibit marks and so should be covered to compliment the overall exhibit.

Exhibits must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. Any entry removed before 4pm at County Rally will be disqualified. All exhibits and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and YFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained – therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

TIMING

Allowance of one hour to include final checks and measurement of the exhibit. Before leaving the competing area, competitors will be given a further 5 minutes to clear and tidy the work site. Competitors may unpack their equipment and plant material/flowers onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session commences. Competitors may set up their flower arranging support material/mechanics in position prior to the one-hour practical session if required. Competitors are able to set up their display bay before the one-hour practical session commences.

NOTES

Competitors to note that all buckets will be checked by Stewards on arrival for pre-arranged foliage. Competitors must not bring photographs/diagrams of previously arranged Floral Exhibits into the competing arena. Any competitor found doing so may be disqualified.

Competitors must wear white coats during the period of the competition. Club, County and Sponsor logos are permitted on either the front or the back of the coats. A "Competitions Manual" is available from NAFAS Enterprises Ltd. www.nafas.org.uk

EXHIBIT

Is composed of natural plant material in all its forms, contained within a space as specified in a show schedule. Accessories need to go in front of backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles, and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit, unless otherwise stated. More than one placement may always be included, unless otherwise stated. In all exhibits natural plant material must predominate. Plant material must now predominate in all Still Life Exhibits

NATURAL PLANT MATERIAL

Natural plant material is any vegetable matter. It includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, foliage, fungi, vegetables and seaweed or made-up plant material. It is acceptable to enhance plant material by the application of oil, milk, wax, leaf shine, or other similar products.

ARTIFICIAL PLANT MATERIAL

Artificial plant material is realistic or fantasy plant-forms, made wholly or partly from non-plant material. This includes, clay, glass, metal, plastic, plaster, polyester, shells, silk, wax, etc. This also includes fabric and ribbon made from a non-plant source, which is used as a substitute for natural plant material in an exhibit. Artificial plant material is not allowed unless specifically permitted in a show schedule (see reasons for disqualification). Artificial plant material or artificial plant forms that are an integral part of a container, base, background, or accessory are permitted. Artificial grass turf must not be used for any purpose including bases.

ACCESSORIES

Anything other than natural plant material in an exhibit, such as, feathers, shells, stones, wax candles. The following are not accessories and may also be used unless prohibited by the show schedule: backgrounds, bases, containers holding plant material, drapes, exhibit titles, and mechanics. These may be decorated in any way, but greater credit should be given for use of natural plant material where appropriate.

REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATION

Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, i.e. the measurements or the components. (Just remember – it is better to aim to be at least several cms smaller than the size allowed as the size stated is the MAXIMUM size). Inclusion of artificial plant material (unless specifically allowed by a show schedule). Inclusion of fresh plant material that does not have roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material. Exceptions: Air Plants, Cacti, Fruits, Grass Turf, Lichen, Moss, Succulents, Vegetables, and long lasting plant material which will remain turgid for the duration of a show. (Definition of turgid – the state of firmness of plant tissue resulting from adequate moisture, causing the plant cells to be fully expanded).

NOT ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE DISQUALIFICATION: the term used when an exhibit does not comply with the requirements of the schedule – see NAFAS reasons for disqualification above. The judge will write 'Not according to schedule' and the reason.

SCALE OF MARKS

If a very high number of entries are received, on the day, YFYFC reserves the right to use the NFYFC 'Standards Judging' system i.e. exhibits will be in the Excellent, Proficient or Competent categories.

16 TEAM COOKERY (Theme: Festival Food) (NFYFC)

See National Rules on www.nfyfc.org.uk

Teams to consist of three members, one must be 28 years of age or under, one must be 21 years of age or under and one must be 16 years of age or under, on 1st September 2025.

***New* All teams must have at least one person who is 18 on the day of the County final.**

PROCEDURE

Each team will be required to prepare and display a three dishes that could be served at a Festival using the best of British produce.

Teams must **promote local produce** within their displays. The menu must include three courses, one starter, one main and one dessert. Each course will be required to serve two people. A drink does not count as a course and will not be scored. Teams must ensure each course involves a cooked element, prepared from raw ingredients, demonstrating cookery skills. (It is advised that the combination of smoked salmon and cream cheese is not included). Competitors are allowed to bring their own recipe/cookery books with them for reference (the use of mobile phones will not be permitted).

TEAM REQUIREMENTS

Work on two trestle tables. This includes an area to prepare and an area to cook with two (2) butane gas stoves (gas stoves provided by teams). Cook and display their exhibit within the one-hour time limit. Have recipe details available throughout the practical session for judge's inspection. During the period of the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges or Stewards. **No other person, other than their team members, will be allowed in the competing area.** Teams will not have access to an electrical supply but will have access to water. Teams may not use liquid nitrogen.

TIMING

Teams will be given **1 hour** to create their dishes which **includes** preparation and tidying of the site and to finish their exhibit. Competitors will be penalised at the rate of one mark per minute or part thereof over allotted time. At the County Rally, teams will be allocated their workspace and display space. Display bays may be set up before the one-hour preparation and cooking time, and teams may unpack their equipment and ingredients onto the worktable before the one-hour practical session. At the end of the one hour preparation and cooking time, teams should have tidied the site leaving a clear (wiped) work table with only the gas stoves on it – i.e. they should have packed away their equipment and wiped down the work table. The gas stoves should be left on the worktable to cool before being packed away.

EQUIPMENT

Competing teams are required to provide:

All ingredients (these may be brought to the competition already weighed out and vegetables ready washed – **all other work must be executed on site in the practical session**).

Two (2) butane gas stoves (currently available from approx. £15.00 from camping and outdoor retailers/Argos/Amazon). The stoves must be like the images below and be fuelled by butane cartridges:



DISPLAYS

Competitors will be allowed a maximum display space of 90cm (width) X 60cm (depth) X height optional (i.e. no height limit) which to display the courses to their best advantage. Please note these are the EXTERNAL dimensions. If teams use back and/or side boards the whole of the board must be within the dimensions given. Any accessories or drapes used on the outside walls will be included in the overall size limit of the exhibit. **Displays which exceed the above dimensions will be disqualified.**

Teams must:

- Display a menu card.
- Display details of recipes.

There are no limitations on the contents of the display. Menu cards, recipes, and display accessories (non-food items) etc may be brought to the competition ready prepared.

Displays must remain in position throughout the day of the competition. Any entry removed before the Presentation of Awards will be disqualified. All displays and competitor's property will be at the risk of the competitor and YFYFC cannot accept liability for any loss or damage sustained – therefore, competitors are advised to use items of little established value.

Competitors must wear white coats or equivalent and be thoroughly smart in their appearance. Competitors will be required to wear hairnets/ beard nets or hats.

NO DRIVING LICENCE = NO COMPETING.

PROCEDURE: Competitors will be required to drive the vehicle and livestock trailer around a marked out course. One competitor driving around the course, then the other competitor reversing back along the same course. Anyone seen to be driving in an unsafe manner will be stopped/disqualified by the competition judge or steward.

ELIGIBILITY: Competitors must be 28 years or under on the 1st September 2025 and a full member of a club affiliated to the NFYFC. Competitors will be required to produce their current online membership card or printed equivalent.

ALL COMPETITORS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 MUST HAVE A SIGNED PARENTAL CONSENT FORM ON THEM AT ALL TIMES THROUGHOUT THE DAY AS WELL AS THEIR ONLINE MEMBERSHIP CARD.

PROCEDURE: Competitors are to create a Floral Arrangement to the theme of "Wild West" – an arrangement to be viewed from the front only.

Arrangement MUST NOT exceed 60cm wide x 60cm deep x unlimited height. Display board behind arrangement is allowed, MUST be within the given measurements. Arrangement to be composed of natural plant material. Pre-cut and pre-soaked floral foam allowed. BIO-DEGRADABLE floral foam must be in a water container. Competitors must wear white coats. No pre-cut flowers.

Competitors will have a table for unpacking/setting up/working from. Then a separate display table will be available for all finished products to go on.

TIMING:

Competitors are allowed one hour to include final checks and measurement of the exhibit. Before leaving the competing area, competitors will be given a further 5 minutes to clear and tidy the work site. Competitors may unpack their equipment and plant material/ flowers onto the work table before the one hour practical session commences. Competitors are able to construct and tape their oasis in position prior to the one hour practical session if required. Competitors are able to set up their oasis and display boards before the one hour practical session commences.

23 JUNIOR BOAT RACE (NON-ALCOHOLIC) (YFYFC)

ELIGIBILITY: Competitors must be 16 years and under on 1st September 2025 and a full member of a club affiliated to the NFYFC. Competitors will be required to produce their current online membership card or printed equivalent.

PROCEDURE: Teams will consist of 4 Junior members. Each team member will down a pint of a given non-alcoholic drink in the style of a relay. Spillages will be taken into account. After each competitor finishes their pint, they must put the pint glass on their head before the next competitor starts drinking. The winner will be the team who finishes all 4 pints first. Competitors must make the YFYFC aware of ANY allergies with confirmation of entry.

SCALE OF MARKS:

Out of 100, based on placing in competition. Fastest time wins.

24 HALF YARD OF ALE (FEMALE) (ALCOHOLIC) (NA)

ELIGIBILITY: Competitors must be between 18 years and 28 years of age on 1st September 2025, and a full member of a club affiliated to the NFYFC. Competitors will be required to produce their current online membership card or printed equivalent.

Competitors must be over the age of 18 years on Saturday 23rd May 2026. NO ID = NO COMPETING.

PROCEDURE: Female competitors will be required to drink a half yard of alcoholic ale.

Competitors must make YFYFC aware of ANY allergies with confirmation of entry.

Non-alcoholic option available. Competitors MUST notify YFYFC by 11th May 2026, for it to be ordered.

SCALE OF MARKS:

Competitors will be timed and marked on speed and spillages.

25 YARD OF ALE (MALE) (ALCOHOLIC) (NA)

ELIGIBILITY: Competitors must be over 18 years of age on 1st September 2025, and a full member of a club affiliated to the NFYFC. Competitors will be required to produce their current online membership card or printed equivalent. **Competitors must be over the age of 18 years on Saturday 23rd May 2026. NO ID = NO COMPETING.**

PROCEDURE: Male competitors will be required to drink a yard of alcoholic ale.

Competitors must make YFYFC aware of ANY allergies with confirmation of entry.

Non-alcoholic option available. Competitors MUST notify YFYFC by 11th May 2026, for it to be ordered.

SCALE OF MARKS:

Competitors will be timed and marked on speed and spillages.

26 NFYFC AUCTIONEERING (NA/NFYFC)

ELIGIBILITY: Competitors to be 28 years of age or under on 1st September 2025 and a full member of a club affiliated to the NFYFC. Competitors will be required to produce their current online membership card or printed equivalent.

PROCEDURE:

Each Competitor will be required to auction 3 lots.

Prior to the auction commencing the competitor will view a total of 6 Lots which will include agricultural and non-agricultural items.

The Competitor will then have 20 minutes to draft a handwritten, catalogue-style description and provide a valuation figure for each Lot on the day of the competition.

The competitor is to hand their descriptions and valuations to the judge prior to the auction.

The competitor will then choose 3 Lots at random 'out of a hat' from the 6 available, to sell.

The judge will identify one of the Lots to have a reserve. The item and price of the reserve lot is at the judge's discretion.

The competitor should provide an introduction and then open the auction sale, outlining the procedure and relevant conditions of the sale e.g. the payment process, order of the auction, buyer's commission rate.

Competitors at the YFYFC Final will not be eligible to watch other competitors until after they have competed.

Stewards will be placed in the audience to act as purchasers on the lots to ensure there is enough bidding to enable the competitor to demonstrate the skill. These stewards will be anonymous to the competitor and will only bid if no other bids are forthcoming.

Stewards will have no knowledge of the item's values provided by the competitor.

Once all the lots have been 'sold' the auctioneer will close the auction in a suitable way and the judge will work out their score.

29 NFYFC JUNIOR GENSB (MIXED) TUG OF WAR (NA/NFYFC)

ELIGIBILITY: A Junior GENSB team shall consist of between 7 and 10 pulling members, male or female, who must be between 12 years & 17 years of age and under on 1st September 2025. **This means competitors MUST have attained their 12th birthday on 1st September 2025 and may be 18 on the day of the competition.**

TOWA TUG OF WAR RULES

All competitors must be full members of a Club affiliated to the NFYFC (**Please note: members cannot compete for more than one club and county in one membership year**). Competitors at the National Final must both present their YFC digital membership card and also, if over 18, have additional official photographic ID (Passport or Driving Licence). Under 18's must have a signed parental consent form.

Coaches and Trainers – Only one Coach is permitted with each team during pulling. Only one Trainer or "Water-Carrier" is permitted with each team. During pulling the Trainer shall take up position well clear of both teams and is not permitted to address any remark to them during actual pulling. Neither the Coach nor Trainer need comply with other rules of eligibility.

SUBSTITUTION PRIOR TO THE COMPETITION

All substitutes must be eligible to compete in the County Final.

REPLACEMENT PULLERS

All replacements must have been eligible to compete in the County Final.

On the day of the NFYFC Final members are only allowed to pull and compete in one age or gender category.

WEIGHING-IN PROCEDURE AND WEIGHT LIMITS

Teams will be notified of Weighing-in and report times prior to the County final (see timetable).

The 8 members of the Ladies or Men's teams will be weighed as one and will not exceed:

Men - 680 kg

Ladies - 560 kg

The members of the Junior GENSB team will be weighed as one with the initial weight limit of:

Junior GENSB - 560kg

An additional 10kg will be added to the weight allowance for each female in the team up to a maximum of 600kg.

The competitors will be stamped or marked on a limb in a position easily seen by the Judge but not easily erased by the rope or competitors clothing.

At weigh-in all team members must have their boots available for inspection by the judges.

All boots should comply to the TWIF outdoor boot specifications available from:

SUBSTITUTION ON THE DAY – please refer to the National rules.

After a team has pulled the first end of the first match, the team is able to use a substitution. A substitute may replace any one puller for the remainder of the competition (Age restriction of team still applies). Substitution may be used for tactical reasons or due to injury. Any potential substitutes must (unless otherwise instructed by competition organisers) have been signed in and had their membership card checked prior to pulling in the competition. At the time of substitution, both the puller to be replaced and the substitute must report in full pulling outfit, (shirts, shorts, stockings, and footwear) to the Chief Judge/Chief Steward who may designate an official to deal with the substitutes. A small (bathroom type) scale must be available at the pulling area, (in a suitable place, on solid surface), to determine the weight difference between the two pullers. The substitute puller must be of equal weight or less than the puller he/she replaces. Directly after the change, the Chief Judge or designated official shall cancel the stamp or marking of the replaced puller, and indicate a similar marking on the substitute, with an indelible marker. This change shall then be recorded.

N.B. For GENSB teams; Once weighed in, the team weight allowance cannot be improved upon through substitution i.e. increasing the number of females on the team. Any weight bonus must be removed accordingly if the number of females has decreased below the original bonus threshold of the team.

E.g. Team = 5 males & 4 females = 600kg (560kg + 40kg bonus). A female puller of 70kg is substituted for a male.

The male must weigh 60kg or less (Both in full pulling gear) because the resultant bonus has decreased.

DRAW AND BYES

The Chief Judge and Chief Steward will confirm the number of leagues teams shall be drawn into. However, there shall be no more than 7 teams in one league.

PULLING

Each team shall pull a match of 2 ends against every other team in the league with points awarded as follows:

- 3 points to the winners in a straight pull (two straight pulls)
- Nil points to the losers in a straight pull
- 1 point to each team winning 1 pull each

Note: If teams are drawing on points at the end of the league; they shall be ranked using the following system until differentiation:

1. Results of matches (between the teams drawing on points).
2. Matches won (most matches won).
3. Cautions (least number throughout pulling).
4. Team weight (lowest team weight at weigh in).
5. Coin toss or draw.

If there is one league; the top 4 teams on points shall enter the semi-final competition as follows: 1st v 4th; 2nd v 3rd.

If there are two leagues; the top 2 teams on points from each league shall enter the semi-final competition as follows: League one winner v League two runner up League two winner v League one runner up.

The losers of the semi-finals shall pull off for 3rd and 4th places before the winners of the semi-finals pull off for 1st and 2nd places.

The semi-finals, 3rd/4th pull off and the final matches shall be won by two (2) pulls out of three (3).

30 JUNIOR MYSTERY JUDGING (NA)

Competitors to be 16 years of age or under on 1st September 2025.

31 INTERMEDIATE MYSTERY JUDGING (NA)

Competitors must be aged 21 and under on 1st September 2025.

32 SENIOR MYSTERY JUDGING (NA)

Competitors must be aged 28 and under on 1st September 2025.

MYSTERY JUDGING RULES (NA)

Competitors will be required to judge and give reasons on **4 Mystery Items** – (to be revealed on the day of the competition final).



Accessing mobile phones during the competitions will be an instant disqualification, (unless it is an emergency call at the steward's discretion).

PROCEDURE

Items will be designated A, B, X and Y. All competitors must provide and wear a white coat, which must be worn during the period of the competition. Throughout the competition, competitors must not communicate directly or indirectly with any person other than Judges and Stewards under penalty of disqualification. Members of the public will not be allowed in the judging area.

ELIGIBILITY: Competitors must be over 16 years of age and under 28 years of age on 1st September 2025 and a full member of a club affiliated to the NFYFC. Competitors will be required to produce their current online membership card or printed equivalent.

The minimum qualification for competitors is a **British Wool "Blue Seal"** or an equivalent qualification from a recognised sheep shearing training provider. Copies of qualifications to be inspected on the day of the competition prior to shearing. This competition is open to those over the age of 16 with a Blue Seal or equivalent. If someone under the age of 16 has been awarded the Blue Seal they are eligible to compete in the competition at the discretion of NFYFC & British Wool. If a competitor is unable to produce an appropriate certificate of competence they will not be allowed to compete, e.g. a British Blue Wool Seal Certificate. The certificate will be checked by the Judges.

PROCEDURE: Competitor is required to hand shear one sheep and wrap the fleece. Competitors to bring their own shears. Any remaining unshorn sheep from the competition must be sheared prior to competitors leaving. Shearers must wrap their own wool or provide another member to wrap it for them, if their wool is not wrapped there will be penalties.

Competitors must wear suitable clothing and footwear.

TIMING:

The judge will set the time limit. Time will be taken into consideration in the event of a tie. Please refer to the latest British Isles Shearing Competition Association (BISCA) rules.


